Despite its immateriality, dance leaves traces: photographs, video recordings, notes, reviews,... How do these documents become artistic objects, recycled, reworked and staged by contemporary choreographers? What is at stake here? Marie Quiblier observes and analyses different modalities of apparition and exploitation of archives on dance stages. She will invoke the cases of *Tout ceci (n')est (pas) vrai* [All this is (not) true], created by Thierry Baë in 2003; *Roman Photo, Flip Book, 50 ans de danse* [Fotonovela, Flip Book, 50 years of dance] by Boris Charmatz, first presented in 2007; *Histoire(s)* [Story/ies] and *Débords. Réflexions sur la Table Verte* [Overhangs. Reflections on The Green Table] by Olga de Soto, realised in 2004 and 2012 respectively.

What is today's purpose of an information centre for performing arts?

What is the artistic and political context in which information centres for the performing arts emerged? What has their evolution been like until today?
